^{*}To test for industry certification, students must earn a C or higher each semester of the veterinary assisting program. Testing takes place in the spring during the Vet 5 year. Students earning industry certification will be awarded a CTE cord to wear during graduation.

Because of the project based learning platform of this class, students are required to participate in 2 out of 4 dog washes. Participation in more than one is strongly encouraged.

Dog wash dates are (tentatively): 9/24/12, 11/19/12, 2/4/13, and 3/24/13

These dates are given well in advance, but may change due to extenuating circumstances.

Classroom Expectations:

Everyday:

- 1. **RESPECT** the teacher (myself or a substitute), your classmates, and yourself.
- 2. **LISTEN** to and follow all directions the first time they are given. Be attentive and engaged in the topic of the day.
- 3. Come to class prepared with supplies and completed assignments. Assignments are due at the beginning of class. Late work will NOT be accepted and will result in a zero.
- 4. Be on time, in your seat, with work out on your desk. This means by the time the bell rings! Tardiness is a disruption to the entire class. Excessive tardiness will not be tolerated and will result in an administrative referral
