1. 3 main demos: Apothecary (medicine), Weapons & Armor, Culture & Arts; all with their own tent.
 2. All members are in garb and character. Interactions with patrons can consist of discussions about any aspect of medieval society or just entertainment for the patron. Street theater comes in at this point.
 3. Dances are done to entertain patrons. Some dances allow members to pull in patrons and teach them the dance.
 4. Stage combat is performed and basic use of weapons and armor is shown.
 5. Entertainers guild performs a play... St. George and the dragon..... comedy- short play.
 6. The society usually provides personnel to the fair to help in areas where people are needed such as help as security when needed.
 7. Carry banners for shops or other shows/events or provide "armed knights" as escorts for royalty at fair during the noon parade.
