Infinitives

- * The **present** infinitive tends to show **SAME TIME AS** the main verb.
- * The **perfect** infinitive tends to show time **BEFORE** the main verb.
- * The **future** infinitive tends to show time **AFTER** the main verb.

Subject Accusative

- *Ego dīcō mē Bertham amāre.
- *Tū dīcis tē Bertham amāre.
- *Titius dīcit SĒ Bertham amāre.

Subject Accusative

- * Nōs dīcimus NŌS Bertham amāre.
- * Vōs dīcistis VŌS Bertham amāre.
- * Titius et Decimus dīcunt SĒ Bertham amāre.
