Consider the vocabulary. If there are more than seven words on the page that you don't know, you might want to try a different book. Remember, you're looking for books that are fun, interesting and appropriate for you!
- 3. Read! Read! Read!:** While you should read a minimum of two books this summer, we hope our lists will inspire you to read much, much more.
