## Huck Finn Panel Discussion

As a concluding activity, we will discuss the topic of *Huck Finn* as a racist novel. You will be assigned one of 5 responses to this query.

- 1. *Huck Finn* fights racism. The book is fundamentally and completely against racism; ending racism is the biggest objective of the book.
- 2. *Huck Finn* is an "open wound." It is too playful or nonchalant with a very painful topic (racism) and is much too lighthearted for such a serious issue.
- 3. *Huck Finn* fights racism, but not well enough. The points that Twain makes about racism are weak, easily misinterpreted, and too lighthearted to make a difference.
- 4. *Huck Finn* is unconsciously racist. Twain does not intend the book to be racist, but different words, events, and characters show his subconscious tendency to be racist.
- 5. *Huck Finn* is not really about racism. While it does touch upon race relations, they are not the main point of the story. There are bigger ideas in the story.

- 3. At least five quotes that prove your group's position and interpretation.
- 4. At least two images that correspond with your presentation.

Remember, each group member will participate in the presentation of your stance. You must be prepared to answer any questions the audience has and defend your stance.
