Line 2 Two words that describe the title
(ADJECTIVES)

Line 3 Three words that show the action of the
title (VERBS)

Line 4 Four words that express a feeling about
the title (PHRASE)

Line 5 One word that is another word for the
title (SYNONYM)

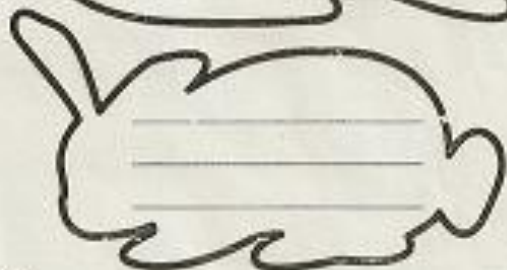

Diamante

- Lines 1 and 7 states subjects that are opposites
Ex. Puppy/dog You can do two people, two seasons, two animals, a person and thing, etc.
- Line 2 contains 2 adjectives about subject of Line 1
- Line 3 contains 3 action words specific to subject of Line 1
- Line 4 contains 4 adjectives. The first 2 describe the subject in Line 1 and the second 2 describe the subject in Line 7.
- Line 5 contains 3 action words specific to subject of Line 7
- Line 6 contains 2 adjectives about subject of Line 7

The first line has 5 syllables.

The second line has 7 syllables.

The third line has 5 syllables.
