Underage Drinking & Alcohol Possession Penalties

Possession of Alcoholic Beverages

Providing alcohol to an individual under the age of 21:

Penalties: Maximum \$2,500 fine and a one-year prison term.

Possession of alcohol by an individual under the age of 21, opened or unopened container:

Penalties: Maximum \$500 fine and a six-month prison term.

Illegal transportation of alcohol by an individual under the age of 21:

Penalties: Driver's license suspension for one-year for 1st offense.

Revocation of driver's license for subsequent offenses.

Maximum \$1,000 fine.

Penalties for Underage Drinking & Driving

ZERO TOLERANCE	
1st Offense	Three-month suspension of driver's license.
1st Offense with refusal of testing	Six-month suspension of driver's license.
2nd Offense	One-year suspension of driver's license.
2nd Offense with refusal of testing	Two-year minimum suspension of driver's license.

DUI CONVICTION	
1st Offense	Two-year minimum revocation of driver's license.
2nd Offense	Revocation of driver's license for a minimum of five years or until age 21, whichever is longer. Possible prison term of one year and a maximum fine of \$2,500.
3rd Offense	Revocation of full driving privileges for a minimum of 10 years. Possible prison term of one to three years, and a maximum fine of \$25,000.

Use of a Fraudulent or Fake ID

Possession or use of a fraudulent driver's license or fake ID card:

Penalties: Automatic one-year suspension of driver's license by the Secretary of State.

Obtaining a driver's license through false affidavit is punishable by a prison term of one to three years and a maximum fine of \$25,000 (Class 4 Felony).

Allowing another person to use your identification documents to apply for a driver's license or ID card:

Penalties: Automatic one-year suspension of driver's license by the Secretary of State.

Punishable by a prison term of one to three years and a maximum fine of \$25,000 (Class 4 Felony).

Using a driver's license or ID other than your own or allowing someone else to use your ID:

Penalties: Minimum \$500 fine or 50 hours community service (Class A Misdemeanor).

A second offense will result in a Class 4 Felony.
