Another Point of View

For this project you will need to interview two important people in your life. You will ask them to share with you some thing from your life. This may be an anecdote about you that made them laugh or cry, or simply their opinion of you as you have grown up.

You should interview two very different types of people. (coach/family friend; relative/teacher; mentor/sibling). Try to choose one person who has known you from the earliest part of your life.

Helpful hints:

- Take time before the interview to prepare questions, but don't be afraid to ask other questions (not on your list) during the interview.
- Write questions that give insight into your growth. A person you've know a long time will best be able to respond to this. However, someone like a coach or club leader may be able to talk about your growth in terms of that sport and/or club.
- You may video or audio tape the people you interview (remember to ask permission), or you may take notes.
- When you transcribe this information it can be in a question and answer format or written as a summary.

Note: Chapter Four gives you the opportunity to earn additional points by going the 'extra mile.' You can earn these points by interviewing a third person.

Be thoughtful, careful, and do your best work. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask me.
