Identifications

Notable Quotables

You will be given 25 quotes taken from the works listed above, and asked to provide a brief explanation of the meaning, context, or speaker for each. Again, flash cards will be the best method of preparation for this test element.

Essays

You will be given three questions, and asked to answer two of them in a brief essay. [The best method of preparation](#) for this particular test element is to go through the topics listed above, outline each, making note of the themes, characters, and events.
