Vocabulary

You will be responsible for knowing **all** the vocabulary up to and including Stage 21 of your Cambridge textbook. Be sure to make flashcards and to practice the [online vocabulary](#). You will be given 25 terms, from which you will be asked to choose 20.

Declensions

You will be given 2 nouns to fully decline. Make sure to practice your declensions nightly. Use the [declension sheets](#) found on the Quia.com site. Be able to recognize the declension based on its **genitive singular** ending:

1st: -ae

2nd: -ī
3rd: -is
4th: -ūs
5th: -eī

Conjugation

You will be given 2 verbs and asked to decline them according to specific tenses. Make sure to practice your conjugations each night. Use the [conjugation sheets](#) found on the Quia.com site. Be able to distinguish between the different conjugations based on the sign vowel in the **present infinitive**, e.g.:

- Laudāre
- Docēre
- Discere
- Capere
- Venīre

(also keep straight in your mind [the rules](#) concerning 3rd, 3rd -iō, and 4th conjugations concerning the present and imperfect tenses)

Participles

- You will be given verbs from which you will be expected to form the present active and perfect passive participles, and then decline them so they properly match their noun in **case, number and gender**. Make sure to review the rules for forming participles.
- You will be given several sentences that make use of participles. You will be asked to identify the participle and to whom it is referring, and then translate the sentence.
- Practice identifying and translating participles by using the [exercises](#) on the Cambridge [web site](#).

Reading Comprehension

You will be given a reading similar in style, tone, and vocabulary to those you have read in Stage 21. The best preparation is to re-read the stories in stage 21 so that you can identify the plot lines, characters, and any vocabulary that pops up regularly.
