## **GBC's of Second Grade**

Attendance- It is so important for your child to be at school on time everyday! You will significantly increase your child's chances for success by making sure that he or she is here, and on time, each day. The first bell rings at 8:25. This is when we will be taking up juice and snack on Monday morning, when students do bell-work, and get ready for their day. Please try to have your child here at 8:25 so he or she may take advantage of this preparation time. The tardy bell rings at 8:40. This is when our teaching day begins.

Backpacks- Be sure that your child brings his or her backpack to school everyday so that we can be sure everything makes it to and from school. While unpacking, if a student forgets an item in his or her backpack and has to go back to the backpack to retrieve it during class, he or she will have to sign the conduct log. We will give the students two weeks to get used to this rule. Please, no rolling backpacks. We do not have room for them. Also, please clean out your child's backpack once a week. This will help cut down on debris. Thank you.

Conferences- Good communication between home and school is important to your child's academic success. If there is a need for a conference, one of us will contact you, or you may contact one of us. You may also contact our Parent Liason, Mr. VanDiver at 269-3625. We will be glad to meet with you at any time!

Dress Code- Please be sure that your child is dressed appropriately each day, as is outlined in the school dress code.

Emergency Information- It is incredibly important that we have correct and up-to-date phone numbers for you! If there is an emergency, we need to be able to contact you, so please let us know if your address or phone number changes during the school year.

Field Trips- We will be planning several field trips this year, which are both fun and educational for your child. Be sure to return permission slips quickly so that your child will not have to miss any of these wonderful opportunities! Some of these field trips will include The Montgomery Zoo, \$4.50 per child, and The Planetarium, \$1.75 per child. The Davis Theater is another possible field trip. The cost of a Montgomery Public School bus will be added into the price. This is usually \$3.00-\$4.00 per child. All prices are subject to change.

Grades- We will send home all graded classwork every two weeks, so you should always be aware of how your child is doing in class. Please SIGN the progress report and yellow folder, and RETURN everything that was sent home. This includes ALL papers. Remind your child to always do his or her best work. The grading procedures are as follows:

## **Grading Scale:**

90-100=A 80-89=B 70-79=C 60-69=D 0-60=F

Grading Weights for each subject:

Reading, Math, Science, Social Studies: 65% Test Grades, 35% Daily Grades

Language Arts (English and Spelling): 10% Spelling, 60% Language Tests, 30% Language Daily

Conduct: A, B, C, D, or F

Health and Handwriting: Excellent, Good, Satisfactory, Needs Improvement, Unsatisfactory

Homework- Your child will have nightly homework, which will come home his or her purple folder on the "return" side. Please be sure that it is back in this folder so that it will make it back to school the next day! - Invitations- Students may only hand out invitations (for birthday parties, etc.) if there is one for every child in the class. Otherwise, please take care of this outside of school. We don't want anyone to have hurt feelings!
- Join the PTA- The PTA is a great way for you to get involved at Carver Elementary & Arts Magnet! Information about joining the PTA will be coming home with your child during the first few weeks of school.
- Kindness- An important part of a successful classroom is that all students treat one another with kindness. We expect all students to be kind in their words and actions.
- Lunch- You are more than welcome to eat lunch with your child, and this is always such a fun surprise for them! Please meet your child outside of the cafeteria, and don't forget to check in at the office. Each second grade teacher will inform parents of their child's lunch time.
- Math- We will be following a new curriculum in math this year. It will consist of the new Common Core Standards. Math homework will be sent home in the purple homework folder each night. Please work with your child on his or her math facts. Flash cards are good for this. The faster your child is at math facts, the better he or she is at math.
- Newsletter- The weekly newsletter with the spelling, vocabulary, and amazing words, along with what we will be studying in math, science and social studies will be placed in your child's purple folder each Monday. Please refer to it for information about important class information.
- Office- Remember to check in at the office any time you visit school. This is a school-wide policy and it helps to keep your child safe.
- Paperwork- All forms sent home at the beginning of the school year MUST be returned within the week. These papers are extremely important and must be filed in the student's cumulative folder. Please do not put this off. There are many papers to be signed in the Montgomery Public Schools handbook. Make sure to check there, in the front, as well as the back for any papers that are to be signed. Thank you.

- Reading Log- As a part of the school-wide homework policy, your child should be reading at home every night for at least 20 minutes. Please be sure that you record that he or she has read on the reading log by initialing it. Reading logs will be kept in the purple folder on the "return" side so they may be checked.
- Supplies- A second grade supply list was mailed to you. Please make sure your child has ALL of the supplies listed on the supply sheet so that our year will run smoothly. Each day, your child should come to school with sharpened pencils, crayons, glue sticks, paper, scissors, and his or her purple folder with last night's homework. These are the minimum supplies your child should have in his or her desk EVERY DAY. Please ask your child each day if he or she needs supplies for school. Pencils get lost, so you may want to keep a ready supply and a sharpener on hand.
- Technology- Yes, cell phones are now allowed at school. However, all cell phones must remain in the off position and kept in bookbags until the school day is over. At this time, cell phones may be turned on. No child will be calling home during the day on his or her cell phone. All calls will be made through the teacher, office, nurse, counselor, or Mr.
