Summer Reading Assignment

- 1. In <u>The Pact</u> Sampson, George, and Rameck were inspired to make something of their lives. Write a paragraph between 100-150 words describing their inspiration and give details of each man's results of that inspiration. In a second paragraph of 100-150 words, describe a person who has been inspirational in your life. Give specific details of how this person inspired and/or changed your life.
- 2. Create a concrete poem (one that creates a picture with the way the words are arranged on the paper) about an idea/person/theme presented in your summer reading assignment.
- 3. In <u>Brave New World</u> a futuristic setting was described showing consequences of a utopian society where government mass produced specific characteristics of test tube people. Create an illustration depicting a scene from the novel and create a poem of NO MORE THAN 50 WORDS describing your illustrated scene.
- 4. Create a science fiction story which describes government's involvement in people's lives in a way that could serve as a warning to not let such involvement happen. This needs to be at least 500 words.
- 5. Write a rhymed verse poem (at least one page) about your summer reading selection.
- 6. Create an epic poem (one of a hero) about a person from your summer reading. The poem needs to give specific heroic traits as discussed in the novel. (at least one page)
- 7. Write about The Bill of Rights and what it guarantees and how life would be different without it. (150-300 words)
- 8. President Obama's education speech and <u>The Pact</u> are two examples of inspirations about taking control of one's life and setting goals. Create a poem comparing the speech with <u>The Pact</u>. (one page minimum)
