Explanation of *Polysyndeton*: *Polysyndeton* is a list or series of words connected with the repeated use of the same conjunction.

#### > Purpose:

- ✓ Each word connected by the "and" (or any other conjunction) is more emphasized than without it
- ✓ Slows readers down so they can absorb the information fully
- ✓ Implies that both words or phrases connected by the conjunction are equal in some way
- ✓ Create a sense of endlessness
- ✓ Creates a sing-song rhythm

## Etymology of Term:

> Comes from Greek *poly* (many) + *syndetos* (bound together)

#### Contrast to a Similar Term.

- > Polysyndeton's opposite. Asyndeton
  - ✓ No conjunction used at all.

#### Latin Example:

Veni  $\underline{et}$  vidi  $\underline{et}$  vici.  $\rightarrow$  I came  $\underline{and}$  I saw  $\underline{and}$  I conquered.

## English Example.

John West has excellent organizational skills  $\underline{\text{and}}$  superb interpersonal skills  $\underline{\text{and}}$  outstanding written communication skills.

Both ands give the feeling that his list of skills could go on and on.
