Success Strategies: Success is very important to us here at Beaumont High School. We encourage you to learn the skills necessary to make you successful here, at college, and throughout the rest of your life. To be successful in this class, you need to:

- ◇ come to class on time every day
- ◇ bring all necessary materials
- ◇ complete all classwork and homework
- ◇ listen carefully
- ◇ follow directions
- ◇ get along with other students
- ◇ take notes
- ◇ contribute to class discussions
- ◇ ask for make-up work
- ◇ keep track of your progress
- ◇ refer to grading scale for specific details

Objectives: Students will meet grade level standards in the areas of reading, writing, and speaking. Students will demonstrate this learning on multiple measures, including standardized tests.

Materials: Make sure that you bring all needed materials to class every day.

- ◇ sharpened pencils
- ◇ erasers
- ◇ pens (black or blue only)
- ◇ notebook
- ◇ textbooks and handbooks
- ◇ flash drive
- ◇ any other necessary materials

Attendance Policy: Students are expected to be on time to class every day to be prepared to learn.. Excessive absences and/or tardies may negatively affect students' grades. Students with an excused absence are expected to request and turn in all assignments that were missed.

Assignments: Classwork and homework assignments are posted on my homepage on Quia. Check Quia frequently for information about individual assignments.

Grading: Students are expected to complete all class work, homework, and essay assignments to be successful in this class, as well as demonstrate their knowledge on tests.

Behavior: Students are expected to treat themselves and others with respect, and meet the posted classroom expectations. Students who do not meet the expectations will be subject to the discipline policy.

Essays: All major essays are draft writing. Students will need a minimum of two drafts, and significant revision and editing must be evident. Final drafts must be submitted to TurnIn.com, and final drafts will not be graded until paper copies of all drafts are submitted to class and significant revision and editing are evident.

Grading Policy

This grading policy has been adopted by the BHS English/ELL Department and approved by the administration. All teachers in the department will enforce it.

Grading Scale:

- A 92.5 and above
- A- 89.5 – 92.4
- B+ 87.5 – 89.4
- B 82.5 – 87.4
- B- 79.5 – 82.4
- C+ 77.5 – 79.4
- C 72.5 – 77.4
- C- 69.5 – 72.4
- D+ 67.5 – 69.4
- D 62.5 – 67.4
- D- 59.5 – 62.4
- F 59.4 and below

Grades are based on overall percentages accumulated throughout the semester, not the average of the two quarter grades.

Credits:

Per school policy, students who earn a D- or better will receive five credits per semester. Those who earn an F will receive no credits. Students who receive a grade of C- or above in an AP class will receive an extra grade point.

Categories:

- Daily assignments – homework, classroom work: 30%
- Major assignments – essays, reports, projects: 30%
- Quizzes, tests, exams: 20%
- Benchmark exams: 10%
- Participation – classroom discussions, activities, preparedness, cooperation: 10%

Late work:

Assignments are due at the beginning of the period or when collected. Assignments turned in late will receive partial credit as follows:

- Daily assignments – 50% of earned credit for up to a maximum of five school days late, no credit for assignments more than five school days late.
- Major assignments – 90% of earned credit for work submitted one school day late, 50% of earned credit for work turned in two to five school days late, no credit for assignments more than five school days late.
- No late work will be accepted for credit after the last school day of the semester.
- Per the student handbook, students who miss class for scheduled school activities (e.g., sports, field trips) must meet the same assignment deadlines as other students.

Make-up work:

- Make-up work for a cleared absence of up to five school days, including tests, receives full credit for up to five school days after a student's return to class.
- When a student has a cleared absence longer than five school days, she/he is allowed one school day per day of absence to make up work for full credit.
- Make-up work receives no credit until an absence is cleared with the attendance office.
- Assignments missed because of truancy (attendance code R) may not be made up for credit.

Students who know that they must be absent for periods longer than five school days are encouraged to contact the attendance office in advance to request independent study.

Cheating:

All students must always do their own work. Students involved in cheating on assignments or exams will receive no credit for assignments or exams on which cheating has occurred. Research papers and some other major essays and reports will be submitted to www.turnitin.com to be checked for plagiarism. When www.turnitin.com indicates that a student has plagiarized an assignment, it will receive reduced credit or no credit.

Extra credit:

Students are given ample opportunities for achieving success through completion of regular assignments, tests, and other activities. Students may request extra credit work only when all regular work has been completed in a timely manner.

DO:

Complete all assignments
Study for tests
Raise your hand and ask questions
Participate in class
Ask for help
Stay on-task
Treat everyone with respect
Bring pencils, pens, backpack, and notebook daily
Keep personal items (make up, music players, etc.) in backpacks, pockets,
and purses and off
Use technology appropriately
Follow dress code
Pay attention and listen to directions
Use appropriate language
Complete assignments neatly

DON'T:

Apply makeup in class
Eat or drink
Chew gum
Interrupt people who are talking, including the teacher
Call names
Use colored pens or colored pencils on assignments
Use technology for non-instructional purposes
Have music players out in class
Apply personal products (deodorant, perfume, lotions, etc.)
Hit, kick, grab, or push others
Horseplay
Touch things that don't belong to you
Bring permanent markers to school
Wear bathroom/bedroom clothes (slippers, pajamas, etc.)
Wear revealing clothing
Wear clothes inappropriately- sagging, etc.
Wear sunglasses in class
Wear hats/hoods/caps/beanies/head coverings in class
Use profanity or inappropriate language

Expectations:

- ✓ Come in quietly and get to work immediately.
- ✓ Listen attentively while the teacher is teaching.
- ✓ Actively participate in class and allow your classmates to learn.
- ✓ Raise your hand quietly to get the teacher's attention.
- ✓ Treat all classmates and the teacher with respect.

Consequences:

1. Warning
2. Detention
3. Parent contact
4. Referral

*** Severity clause: Steps may be skipped for more severe rule violations. ***

*** Parents will be contacted and involved during the discipline process. ***
