# Nosotros respondemos

Spanish verbs ending in *-er* are conjugated like *-ar* verbs. When conjugating the verb, drop the last two letters (*-er*) to indicate the subject pronoun, then add the proper ending.

Subject Pronoun	Ending to Add After Dropping the <i>-er</i>	Conjugated Forms of the Verb Corner	Meaning
yo	-o	com + o = como	I eat
tú	-es	com + es = comes	you eat
él, ella, Ud.	-e	com + e = come	he or she eats you eat
nosotros, nosotras	-emos	com + emos = comemos	we eat
ellos, ellas, Uds.	-en	com + en = comen	they or you (pl.) eat
