

Dear Parents and Guardians:

Welcome to an exciting year at Cesar Chavez Middle School, I will be your child's science teacher. We will have many opportunities for students to engage in exciting, meaningful activities. To help meet our goal of providing fun, stimulating lab activities, several things are important to ensure success and safety for all students. You can help me by reviewing the following information carefully with your child.

I. Cesar Chavez Goals in Science: Be Safe, Be Responsible, Be Respectful

Be Safe- Always remember to follow directions given the first time asked.

Be Respectful— Treat others as you wish them to treat you. Students will respect the feelings and belongings of everyone, including all students, school staff members, and equipment. Follow directions the first time asked.

Be Responsible by:

1. Being On Time— in your seat & ready to work

A. Tardy: Consequences for tardiness will be as follows:

1st tardy = 2nd tardy = 3rd tardy = 4th tardy: parent
verbal warning, verbal warning, detention contact, detention

B. Emergency Hall Passes: You will receive two emergency hall passes each quarter.

These may be used to go to your locker, the restroom, or to clear a tardy. If you do not use your passes for the quarter, you may turn them in for 20 bonus points each.

2. Being Prepared— notebook, pencil, planner: Come to class with your science notebook, pen or pencil, planner and binder everyday. **DO NOT** throw anything away! Notebooks, binders and homework planners will be checked periodically.

3. Being Productive— Classwork and homework will be assigned daily. Please check student planners for assignments. Work needs to be submitted on time, complete, and neat. Late work is not acceptable. Anyone who misses a class will need to get make-up assignments; this is the student's responsibility! MISSING ASSIGNMENTS ARE CONSIDERED A "ZERO." Missing assignments will quickly lead to failing grades. If you miss a test or quiz, you must take it the day you return.

4. Being Honest— Always do your own work, and take responsibility for your own actions. Students are encouraged to help each other on many assignments, but it is never acceptable for students to copy other's work, or to allow their work to be copied.

II. Steps to Improve Inappropriate Behavior

1. If you are tardy, unprepared, uncooperative, or disrupt learning you will receive consequences which may include: a verbal warning to immediately change the inappropriate behavior, a parent contact, reflective essay, and/or counselor referral to help you change the inappropriate behavior.

2. If you are tardy, unprepared, uncooperative, or disrupt learning **repeatedly** you will be subject to a referral to the assistant principal or principal.

III. Grades

- According to District policy, 60% of your grade is based on assessments and 40% is based on class work and homework, (which includes 10% participation in class)
- You will receive progress reports regularly which must be signed by a parent and kept in your science binder. Grades are posted weekly in the classroom. You may check your grade before or after class.

IV. Materials Needed For Class

- **Textbook.** Cover your textbook. You are responsible for the replacement or damage costs of your textbook.
- **Science Notebook. Spiral Bound / Single Subject (70 pages) / College Ruled.** It must be in the class **every** day.
- **A Three ring binder**, with a divider **for Science.**
- Your Assignment **Planner** for writing Daily Assignments.
- **Lined binder paper**, pencil and blue or black ink pen.
- A calculator, colored pencils, small personal pencil sharpener, highlighter, and ruler (all of these are highly suggested, but not mandatory).

COMMON REASONS FOR LOW GRADES

1. Low grades on quizzes: QUIZZES COUNT 60% OF GRADE. PAY ATTENTION IN CLASS.
(THIS IS THE BIGGEST REASON FOR LOW QUIZ GRADES) STUDY A LITTLE BIT EACH NIGHT. (Review book or science notebook) Get help from teacher at lunch, study for quizzes. Let the teacher know if you are having problems reading or understanding quiz questions!
2. Missing assignments: Make sure you complete work ON TIME, keep organized, make up work missed from absence (use Mrs. Aguirre's website).
