

Self-Monitoring for Comprehension and Achievement

When outlining content material or studying for a quiz or test use the following questions as a guide for understanding. Remember, this is only a guide. You will not necessarily apply all questions to every topic area, and you may want to include information that none of these questions generate on their own.

1. When did this event happen (either specific dates or relative timeframe)?
2. What key figures are involved?
3. Is the event part of a cause and effect relationship? If so, explain the relationship.
4. Draw a diagram of the process.
5. Provide examples.
6. What impact did this person or event have on political, social, or economic issues of the time?
7. Create a timeline of events and including the topic under discussion.
8. Create a graphic organizer depicting the significance of the person, event or issue.
9. List specialized vocabulary terms and their definitions. Provide a sentence of your own using the term correctly or provide an example of the vocabulary word.
10. Write the quotes associated with this person. Explain the meaning of the quote.
