Liturgy p.102	(from Greek meaning public work, service, achievement by and for the people). In the Christian Tradition, liturgy means that the People of God participate in the "work of God". The centerpiece of liturgical celebrations is the Holy Eucharist....
Enculturation	The process by which an individual learns the traditional context of a culture and assimilates its practices and values. (Merriam-Webster, 11th Collegiate Dictionary)
Inculturation	"Liturgical inculturation, viewed from the side of the liturgy ... may be defined as the process of inserting the texts and rites of the liturgy into the framework of the local culture" (p. 30, Chupungco, A.J. (1992) <i>Liturgical Inculturation: Sacramentals, Religiosity, and Catechesis</i>).
