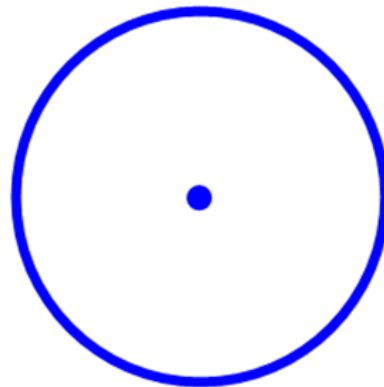


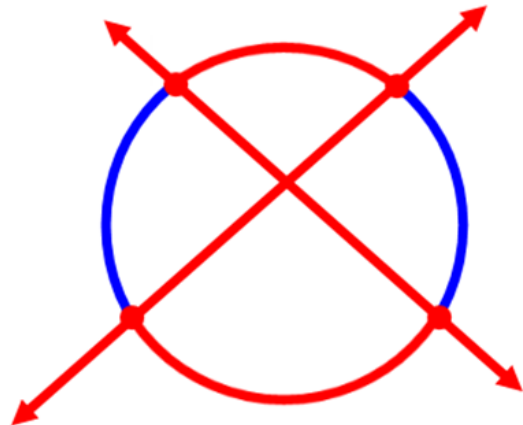
Def. Secant

A figure (line, segment, or ray) that contains a chord of a circle.



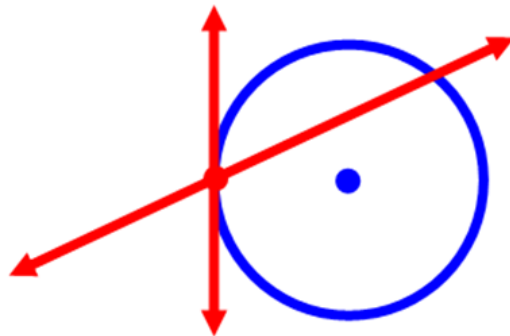

If 2 secants intersect in the interior of a circle, then the measure the $\angle$ formed is one-half the sum of the measures of the arcs intercepted by the $\angle$ and its vertical $\angle$.



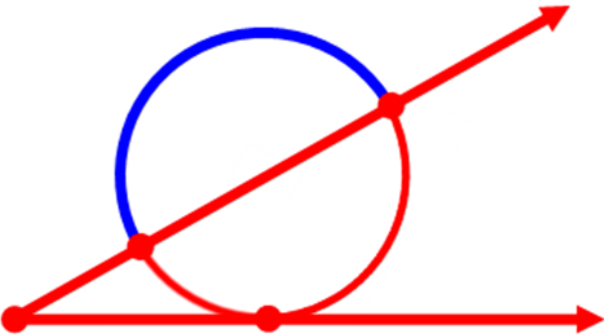
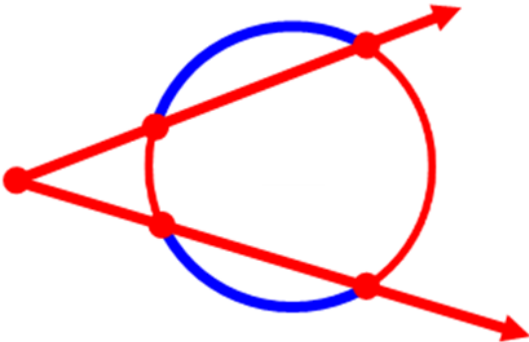

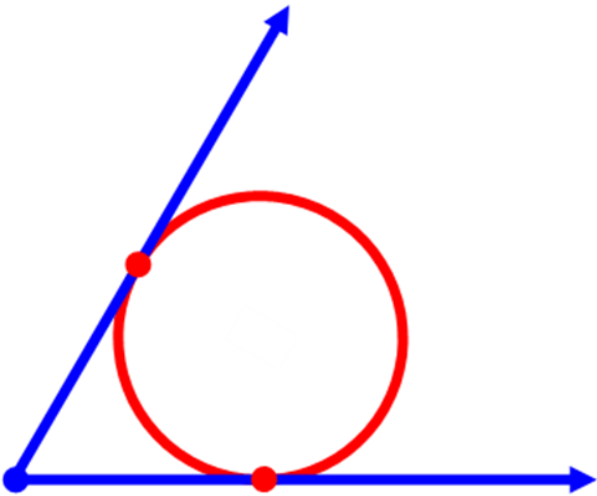
If a secant and a tangent intersect at the pt. of tangency, then the measure of each $\angle$ formed is one-half the measure of its intercepted arc.



Th. 10-14

If 2 secants, a secant and a tangent, or 2 tangents intersect in the exterior of a circle, then the measure of the $\angle$ formed is one-half the positive difference of the measures of the intercepted arcs.
