

Worldviews

A worldview is the framework of ideas, beliefs, or presuppositions, not tested by natural science, through which an individual interprets the world and interacts with it. It may be compared to a pair of glasses through which one is able to see and make sense of reality. Usually the one "wearing the glasses" is unaware of the lenses through which he or she is looking.

| How will it all end? What happens after death? | Unclear. Usually accept the latest scientific explanation. No afterlife. | There may or may not be an afterlife, though justice seems to require it. How all things come to an end is not clear. | Creation will come to an end when God "wakes up" but the cycle will be repeated. After death all beings are either reincarnated or absorbed into God. | The current reign of the gods will end. There will be a judgment based on whether or not humans pleased the gods. | God brings all to an end, followed by a judgment based on human works and/or grace. God will then re-make all things as they were meant to be. |
