All Spanish nouns have gender; they are either masculine or feminine.

1. Spanish nouns ending in *-o* are usually masculine.
2. Spanish nouns ending in *-a* are usually feminine.
3. Days of the week, months of the year, and names of rivers are masculine.
4. The meaning of some Spanish nouns dictates the gender of the word. A man is masculine; therefore, the word *señor* is masculine. A woman is feminine; therefore, the word *señora* is feminine.
5. Some Spanish nouns don't follow a particular rule. You must learn the gender of each of these words individually.
