1. Appius – built one of Rome’s biggest roads (A. Claudius Caecus)
2. Augustinus – Christian priest and author from North Africa
3. Augustus – 1<sup>st</sup> emperor of Rome
4. Caesar – probably Rome’s greatest general
5. Caligula – 3<sup>rd</sup> emperor of Rome, generally thought to be crazy
6. Catilina – attempted to overthrow the Roman government
7. Cato – wealthy and famous Roman politician and general
8. Cicero – Rome’s best-known lawyer
9. Cincinnatus – farmer and hero who saved Rome from Aequians
10. Copernicus – 15<sup>th</sup>/16<sup>th</sup> century astronomer who wrote in Latin
11. Ennius – Roman poet from 3<sup>rd</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> century B.C.
12. Erasmus – Dutch scholar from 15<sup>th</sup>/16<sup>th</sup> century, wrote in Latin
13. Hadrianus – one of Rome’s “Five Good Emperors”
14. Homerus – Greek poet, author of *Odyssey* and *Iliad*
15. Livius – Roman writer of history
16. Marcus Antonius – great general, ally and assistant of Caesar
17. Nero – Rome’s 5<sup>th</sup> emperor, loved music, a little crazy
18. Plautus – writer of comedies
19. Romulus – legendary founder of Rome
20. Sallustius – historian
21. Scipio – general who led Rome in war against Carthage
22. Spartacus – leader of slave rebellion
23. Terentius – writer of comedies
24. Tiberius – 2<sup>nd</sup> emperor of Rome, became crazy
25. Vergilius – most famous Latin writer, author of *Aeneid*

1. Agrippina – mother of emperor Nero
2. Boudicea – fierce Celtic queen, eventually conquered by Romans
3. Calpurnia – politically astute wife of Julius Caesar
4. Clara – patron saint of television
5. Cleopatra – 1<sup>st</sup> century B.C. queen of Egypt
6. Clodia – sued an ex-boyfriend for attempting to poison her
7. Cloelia – girl who saved Rome from the Etruscan Lars Porsenna
8. Cornelia – mother of the Gracchi brothers (famous politicians)
9. Eumachia – wealthy priestess from Pompeii
10. Felicitas – an early Christian martyr
11. Fulvia – extremely influential wife of Marcus Antonius
12. Helena – mother of the emperor Constantine
13. Hildegardis – extremely well-educated 12<sup>th</sup>-century writer
14. Hypatia – mathematician & philosopher from Alexandria, Egypt
15. Iulia Domna – influential wife of emperor Septimius Severus
16. Livia – wife of Augustus, Rome's first emperor
17. Lucretia – heroine from the early Roman Republic
18. Monica – saint, mother of Augustinus
19. Octavia – sister of emperor Augustus, 4<sup>th</sup> wife of M. Antonius
20. Perpetua – early Christian martyr, wrote an autobiography
21. Sulpicia – ancient Roman poet
22. Tarpeia – betrayed Rome to its enemy, the Sabines
23. Theodora – co-ruler with emperor Theodosius
24. Veturia – convinced her son Coriolanus not to attack Rome
25. Volumnia – wife of Coriolanus; helped Veturia (above)
