• The Diaspora – Jews left their homeland of Palestine for Europe, Africa, other parts of the Middle East when the Roman Empire destroyed their Temple in Jerusalem in 70 AD and persecuted the Jewish race.

 The Zionist Movement – In the 1890's and early 1900's Jewish people started to return to Palestine, their homeland, to re-create an identity and Jewish nation.

Why was the new nation of Israel created in 1948?




- After WWII Europe and the US were shocked by the Nazi Holocaust and wanted to provide a home for Jewish people where they would never again be persecuted and suffer genocide.



- Islamic Arab countries vote against it.





 Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Saudi Arabia, Syria invade Israel.




Israel wins "War for Independence" with support of the U.S.

- Britain asks Israel for help & Israel took the Canal back




1956 Suez Crisis

- World pressure forced Israel to give Canal back to Egypt.




Egypt prepared to attack Israel in south at the Red Sea.






 Israel wipes out Arab airfields, then ground forces attack.



- Arabs captured territory by surprise.





U.S. Involvement in Iran




Iran takes Oil Fields

- 1951 Iran's Prime Minister Mossadegh took the oil fields owned by Britain and nationalized them for Iran
- Britain stops

 Iran. US fears that
 Iran might turn to
 the Soviets for aid.



US/C.I.A. in Iran


 Result: In 1953 the C.I.A. gave money to anti-Mossadegh supporters to kick him out of government.



US supports the Shah

 US then puts in power the Shah, king of Iran.

 The Shah was pro-American and he gave the oil fields back to Britain.



Shah's Secret Police


- The Shah ruled with a brutal and oppressive secret police.
- Iran's people hated the Shah's tactics.
- And many hated the US for supporting the Shah.





Jan. 1979 – Iranian Revolution

 A muslim religious leader, Khomeini, led rebels to overthrow the Shah and created a strict religious state based on the Koran, sacred book of Islam.



Nov. 1979 - The Iran Hostage Crisis

 Iranian students take over US Embassy in Tehran, Iran and hold 52 Americans hostage for 444 days.

The Iran Hostage Crisis page 817

- 1. What was the change in power in Iran in 1979?
 - Revolution broke out and the Ayatollah Khomeini led rebels in overthrowing the Shah and establishing a religious state based on the Koran.
- 2. Why did it happen and what did the students want?
 - Carter allowed the Shah to come to the US for cancer treatment, butthe students wanted the Shah returned to Iran for trial in exchange for the American hostages.
- 3. How did it end?
 - Carter refused to negotiate, and after 444 days the hostages were returned when Reagan became President.
