Family letter checklist:

- Letter is handwritten **in French** in blue or black ink on nice stationary
- Letter contains a salutation (Dear _____: (those who did not host, can leave blank for now)
- In the letter, you tell about your pastimes and hobbies
- In the letter, you tell about your school life/classes
- In the letter, you tell a little bit about Indiana/Fishers
- In the letter, you tell how long you've studied French and why you chose to study French
- In the letter, you tell your age and your grade in school
- In the letter, you tell about your family (number of siblings, parents etc.)
- In the letter, you tell about places you've traveled before
- In the letter, you tell what you want to learn while in France and why you want to visit it
- In the letter, you have a proper closing.
- In the letter, you asked the family at least two "burning" questions
- In the letter, you expressed your thanks for their willingness to host you
- In the letter, you had at least 250 words
- In the letter, you used correct grammar, spelling and vocabulary.
- The only resources you used were: Your French class book and notes, a paper dictionary or www.larousse.com (dictionary), and the verb conjugation tables in your textbook or at the following site:
