LETTERS

- Look for the English equivalent of the *sound* the Greek letter makes. Most letters (unshaded) fit this pattern.
- 6 Greek letters are tied to keys that *look* a bit like either the upper- or lower-case Greek letter rather than keys that *sound* like the Greek letters. The shaded pairs below fit this pattern.

DIACRITICAL MARKS

- To make diacritical marks (breathing marks, accents, macrons, iota subscripts, etc.), type the symbol key immediately AFTER typing the letter that should take the mark. (Note that diacriticals are letter-specific; for example, a consonant cannot take an accent.)
- Select breathing marks before accents.
