adversus (prep + acc) – toward, facing, against

altus, a, um (adj) – lofty, high, tall, deep

astrum, -i (n) – star, constellation (NB: stella, -ae (f) – also means star)

barbarus, a, um (adj) – foreign, uncivilized, barbarous, strange-speaking

ingenium, -i (n) - nature, character

laedo, laedere, laesi, laesum – injure, damage, harm

mollis, -e (adj) – soft, gentle, easy

perficio, perficere, perfeci, perfectum – to do thoroughly, accomplish, complete, perfect

plaga, ae (f)- blow, stroke, wound, injury

praeceptum, -i (n) – teaching, precept, principle, rule

quomodo (adv) – in what way, in what manner

regio, -onis (f) – direction, line, district

statim (adv) – at once, immediately

sto, stare, steti, statum – stand, stand by

tacitus, a, um (adj) – silent, kept secret, unmentioned

tribuo, tribuere, tribui, tributum – share, apportion, grant

turpis, -e (adj) – shameful, disgraceful, repulsive (cf. turpiter – the adverb form)

validus, a, um (adj) – strong, able, powerful

varius, a, um (adj) – different, changing

vultus, -us (m) – face, expression, appearance
