

Test Review: Doubt, Faith and the Christian Response

About the test: The test will consist of the following types of questions:

1. Matching: match a term with the best description of the term
2. True/False: decide whether each statement is true or is false
3. Multiple Choice: find the best fit for each question...often it will be a list, with more than one answer required for a correct response
4. Free Response: like the "quiz of lists," respond to questions with words or short phrases
5. Short Answer: questions that require answers that are made up of complete sentences, with examples and details provided

- 3 major divisions of Christianity (recognize)

- 5 major beliefs expressed in the Nicene and Apostles' Creeds (recognize)

- 3 statements of why the Catholic Church teaches that the Catholic Church is the "true Church" (recognize)
- 7 Sacraments (list them)
