Why Minor When You Can Double Major

GW undergraduates can now double-major across schools. Students in the Elliott School of International Affairs or the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences may now major in Japanese without fulfilling the graduation requirements of the Columbian College of Arts and Sciences. Why minor when you can major?

Below are the requirements for the Japanese Major. Please check the 2002-03 Bulletin for a list of classes. Remember that you must fulfill the requirements as stated in the GW Undergraduate Bulletin of the academic year you declared your major.

The following requirements must be fulfilled:

1. **General Requirements**—For students of the Columbian College of Arts and Sciences: The general requirements (G-PAC) as required by the Columbian College. For GW students in schools other than the Columbian College The general requirements as stated under the student's school, permission from the student's advisor, and petition to double major through the dean's office of the Columbian School.
2. **Prerequisite courses**—Beginning Japanese (JAPN 1001-2), and Intermediate Japanese I & II (JAPN 2003-4); or equivalent.
3. **Required for the major**—
 - Required courses—Intermediate Japanese III & IV (JAPN 3105 & 3106), Introduction to Bungo (JAPN 4109), Japanese Literature in Translation (JAPN 3111 & 3112)
 - 18 additional credit hours (6 courses) of upper-division Japanese courses
 - Plus 6 hours in related upper-division courses outside the program, as approved by the program advisor.

Requirements for the Minor in Japanese Language and Literature

1. Prerequisite for JAPN3105: Beginning Japanese (JAPN 1001-2), and Intermediate Japanese I & II (JAPN 2003-4); or equivalent.
2. 18 credit hours of upper-division Japanese courses chosen from below.
3. Of these 18 credit hour, at least 3 credit hours must be chose from 4107, 4108, 4109, 4110, 4121, or 4122. This course must be taken in residence at GW.
