Step 1: What is the noun





Now match the noun with correct gender and number. "El cepillo" is masculine and singular, so we match with "Nuestro" because it is the only one in the group that is masculine and singular.

Step 5: Add "es" or "son" At the beginning

Let's say "Nosotros,-a"

Use "Es" or "Son" at the beginning of the sentence.

Recall that "Es" is for singular items or things.

Recall that "Son" is for plural items or things.

In this case, "el cepillo" is singular so we use "es"
