



Future and Conditional Tenses

What is the difference between these two tenses?

- **Conditional**
 - Expresses what would or could happen
- **Future**
 - Tells what will happen
 - Expresses wonder or probability in the present tense
 - “Who could she be?”

Future Tense

1. The **Future Tense** tells what will happen
 - a. “I will go to the store tomorrow morning.”
2. Expresses wonder in the present tense
 - a. “Who could she be?”
3. Does **NOT** express willingness to do something (querer is used instead)
 - a. “Will you go to the store?”

How to form the Future

Keep the **Infinitive** and add the following endings...

Subject	Endings
Yo	é
Tu	ás
El/Ella/Usted	á
Nosotros	emos
Ellos/Ellas/Ustedes	án

The Conditional

- ~ Expresses what would or could happen
- ~ Keep the **Infinitive** and add the following endings...

Subject	Ending
Yo	ía
Tú	ías
El/Ella/Usted	ía
Nosotros	íamos
Ellos/Ellas/Ustedes	ían

Common Irregulars

Verb	Future	Conditional
Caber – to fit	<u>Cabr</u> é	<u>Cabr</u> ía
Poner – to put/place	<u>Pondr</u> é	<u>Pondr</u> ía
Decir – to tell	<u>Dir</u> é	<u>Dir</u> ía
Haber – to have (auxiliary)	<u>Habr</u> é	<u>Habr</u> ía
Salir – to go out	<u>Saldr</u> é	<u>Saldr</u> ía
Hacer – to do/make	<u>Har</u> é	<u>Har</u> ía
Poder – to be able	<u>Podr</u> é	<u>Podr</u> ía
Tener – to have	<u>Tendr</u> é	<u>Tendr</u> ía
Querer – to want	<u>Querr</u> é	<u>Querr</u> ía
Valer – to have worth	<u>Valdr</u> é	<u>Valdr</u> ía
Saber – to know	<u>Sabr</u> é	<u>Sabr</u> ía
Venir – to come	<u>Vendr</u> é	<u>Vendr</u> ía

Please note that these verbs are in the “yo” form, but the irregular stem is underlined. Just add the endings onto the underlined stem.
