Pronouns are words that take the place of nouns. Subject pronouns take the place of the subject of the sentence.

you (formal/polite)	Ud.		
he, she	él, ella	they	ellos, ellas

## Helpful Hints:

- 1. If you are talking about someone, use he or she as the pronoun.
  - If you are talking  $\underline{to}$  someone, use you as the pronoun.
- 3. You can be singular or plural. If the you is one person, use  $t\acute{u}$  or Ud. If the you is a group of people, use Uds.
- 4. If you are talking about a group of people but you <u>are not</u> one of the group, use *they*. If you are talking about a group of people and you <u>are</u> part of the group, use *we*.
- 5. If the we or they is a group of only males or mixed male and female, use nosotros or ellos.

  If the we or they is a group of only females, use nosotras or ellas.
