Demanding attention.

(re-, back or again + claim, call out)

Recover or assert right to something.

to feel pain, grieve, suffer

Latin

(from dold, to dull)

A period of depression or unhappy listlessness.

(dolor, to feel pain)

Sorrow; grief.

(dolor, to feel pain + -ous, having the quality of)

Marked by sorrow, grief, or pain.

to deceive

(fal, to deceive)

Contrary to fact or truth.

(fal, to deceive + -acy, state or quality of)

A false notion or belief.

(fal, to deceive + -ible, able to be or do)

Capable of making a mistake.
