- a. placable
- b. placate
- c. placebo

to please, appease

Latin

(**plac**, *appease + -able, able to be or do*)

Easily calmed or pacified; tolerant.

(**plac**, *appease + -ate, cause, to be, state, condition*)

To reduce the anger of; to calm.

(*Ltn* > **placebo**, 1st person "I will please.")

A substance containing no medication and given to reinforce a patient's expectation to get well.

26. plic, plicit, plex

- a. plication
- b. explicit
- c. complex

to fold, to tangle

Latin

(**plic**, *to fold + -ation, state, quality or act*)

The act of process of folding.

(**ex-**, *out of or from + plicit, to fold*)

Fully and clearly expressed; literally "to unfold."

(**com-**, *with or together + plex, to tangle*)

Involved or intricate; complicated.

27. -plor(e)

- a. implore
- b. explore
- c. deplorable

to cry out

Latin

(**im-**, *toward + -plore, to cry out*)

To beg for urgently.

(**ex-**, *out of or from + -plore, to cry out*)

To make a careful examination or search.

(**de-**, *out of + -plore, to cry out, -able, able to be or do*)

Worthy of severe reproach; horrible.

28. sent(i)

- a. consent
- b. sentient
- c. sentiment

to feel

Latin

(**con-**, *with or together + sent, to feel*)

Agreement as to an opinion or course of an action; to feel the same way.

(**sent**, *to feel + -ent, inclined to, in a state of*)

Having sense perception; conscious.

(**sent**, *to feel + -ment, state, act or process of*)

An opinion about a specific matter. An attitude based on feeling or emotion instead of reason.

29. (a)spirare

- a. expire
- b. aspirate
- c. inspire

to breathe

Latin

(**ex-**, *out of or from + pire, to breathe*)

To breath one's last breath; to die.

(**aspir**, *to breathe + -ate, cause, to be, state or condition*)

To draw into the lungs; inhale. The speech sound represented by *h*.

(**in-**, *toward or near + -spire, to breathe*)

To motivate, affect, or influence.

30. cant, chant

- a. cantata
- b. cantilena
- c. chanter

to sing

Latin

(*Ltn* > **cantare**, *to sing*)

A vocal or instrumental piece.

(**canti**, *to sing + -en, made of*)

A sustained, smooth-flowing melodic line.

(**chant**, *to sing + -er, someone who*)

A person who chants; a priest who sings.
