ROLE OF THE MALE REPRODUCTIVE SYSTEM

The key role of the male reproductive system is to produce sperm cells in the testes and release them inside a female. If a sperm cell successfully reaches an egg cell and fertilization occurs, an embryo will be formed. The embryo will develop into a baby over the course of a pregnancy. The male reproductive system is controlled by hormones.

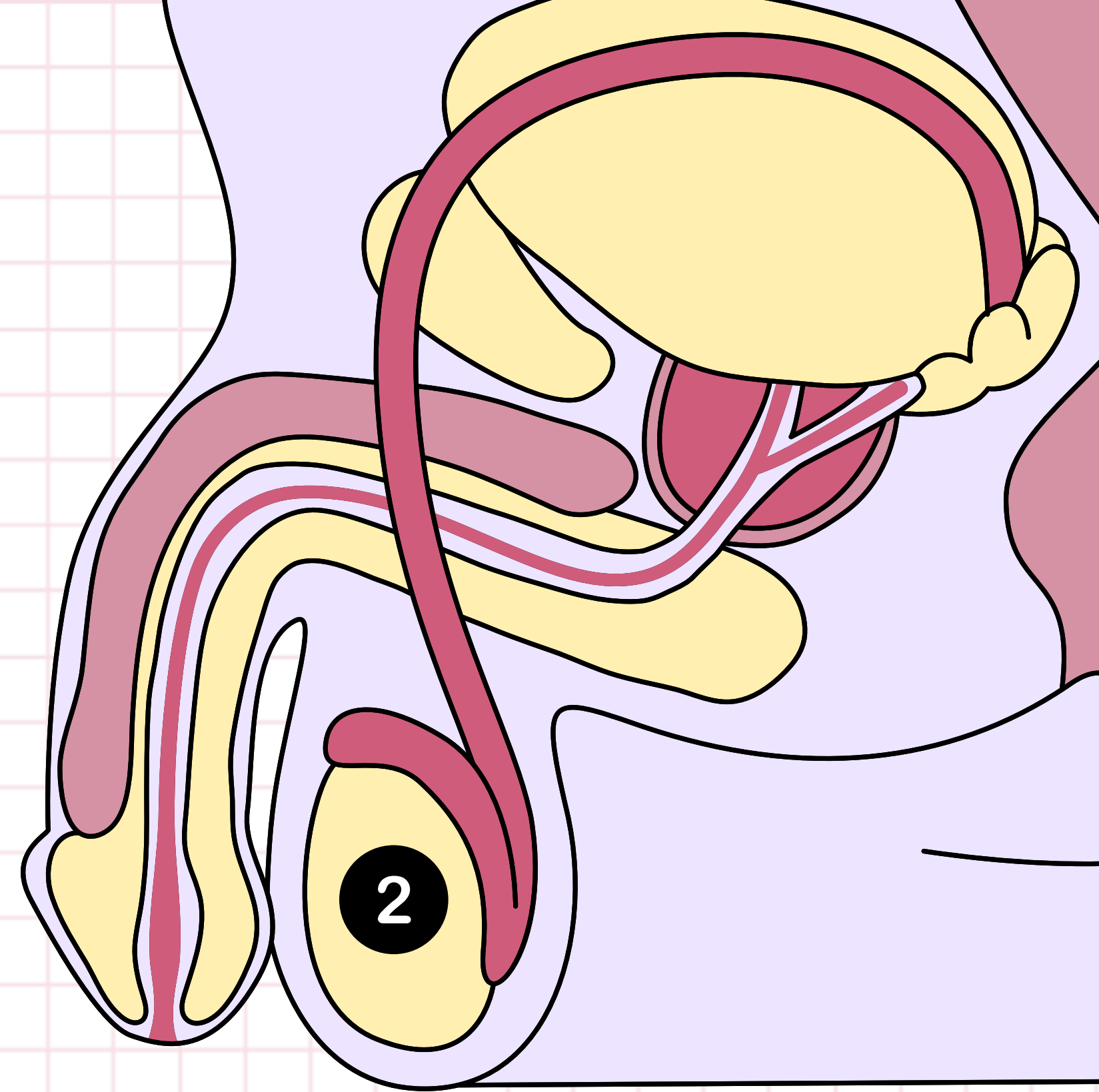
1 - PENIS

The penis is used for both urination and sexual intercourse. It is made of spongy tissue and blood vessels. It also contains the urethra which sperm and urine pass through to leave the body.



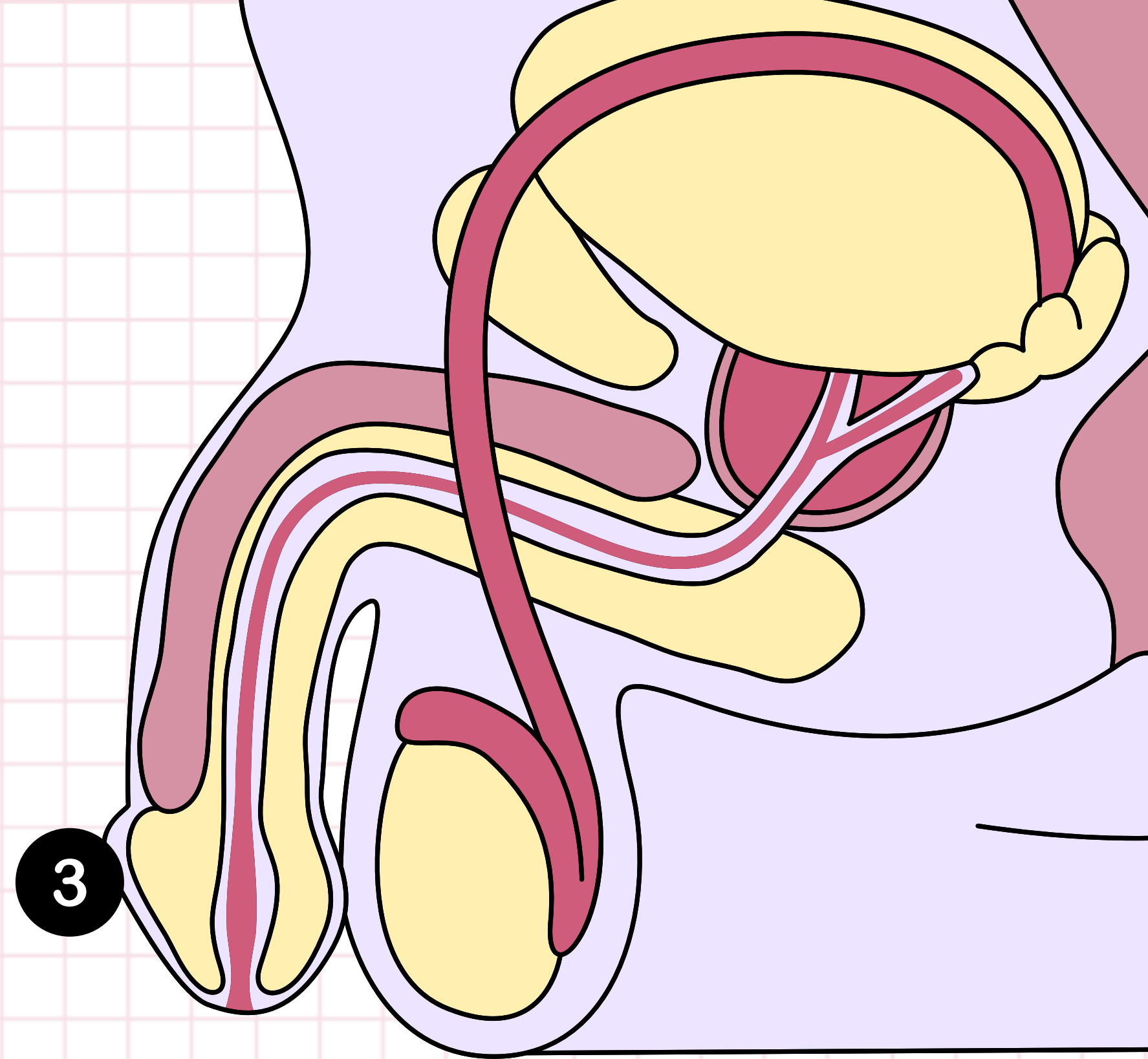
2 - TESTES

The male reproductive system has two testes. The key roles of the testes include making millions of sperm cells and hormones. The hormones produced in the testes impact the way a male body develops in puberty.



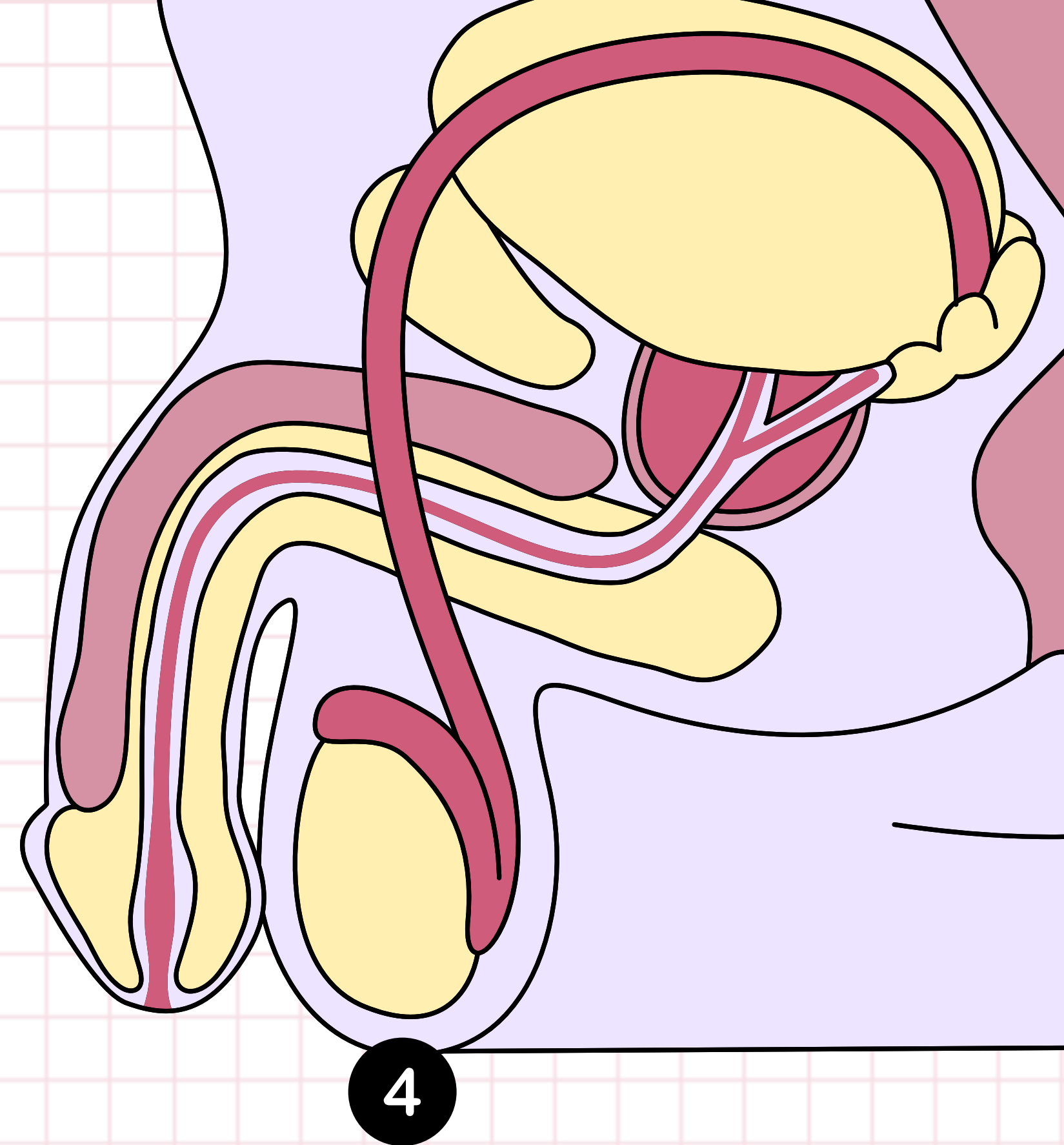
3 - FORESKIN

The foreskin is a retractable fold of skin which covers the end of the penis.



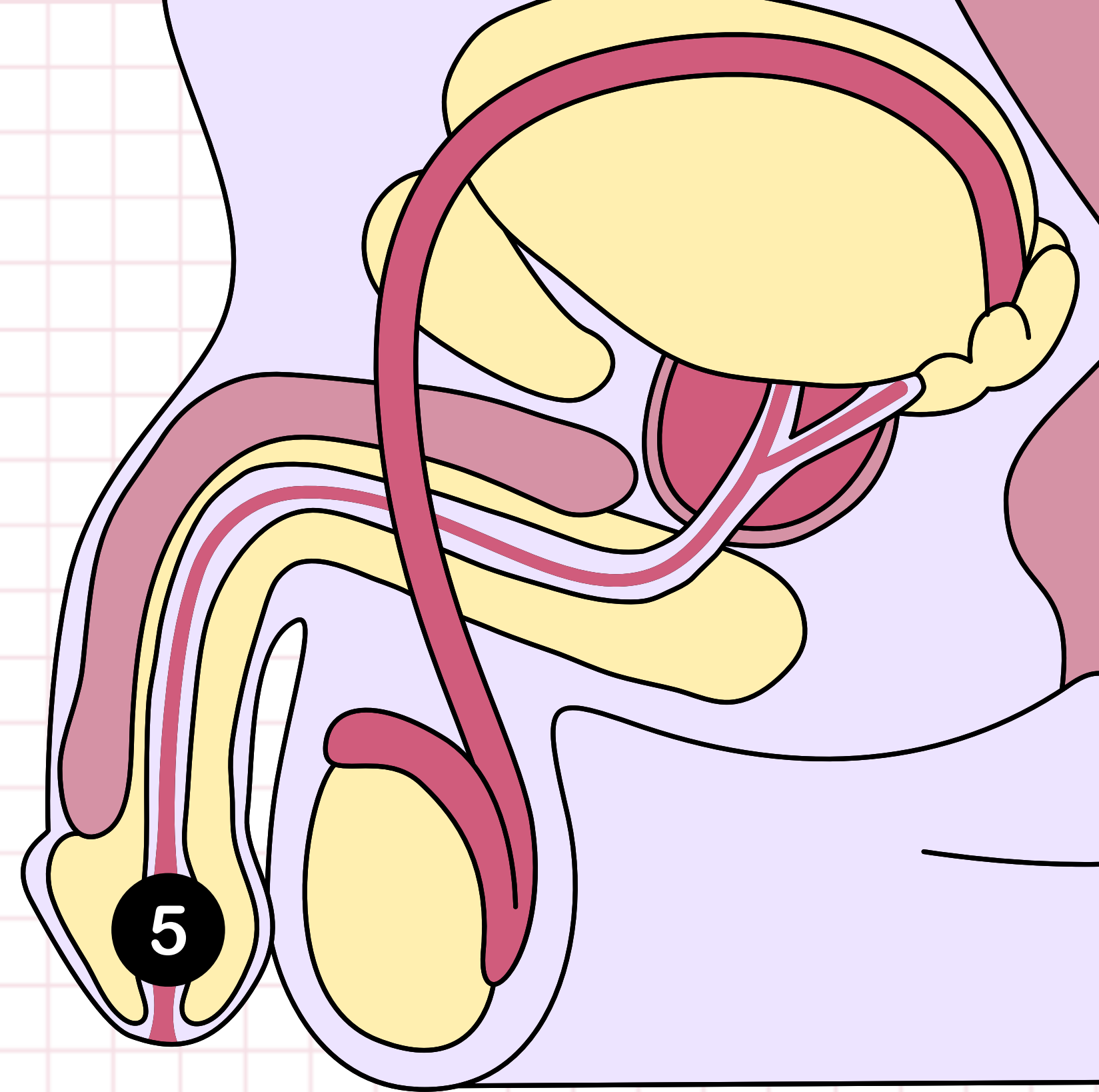
4 - SCROTUM

The scrotum is a bag of skin which contains the two testes.



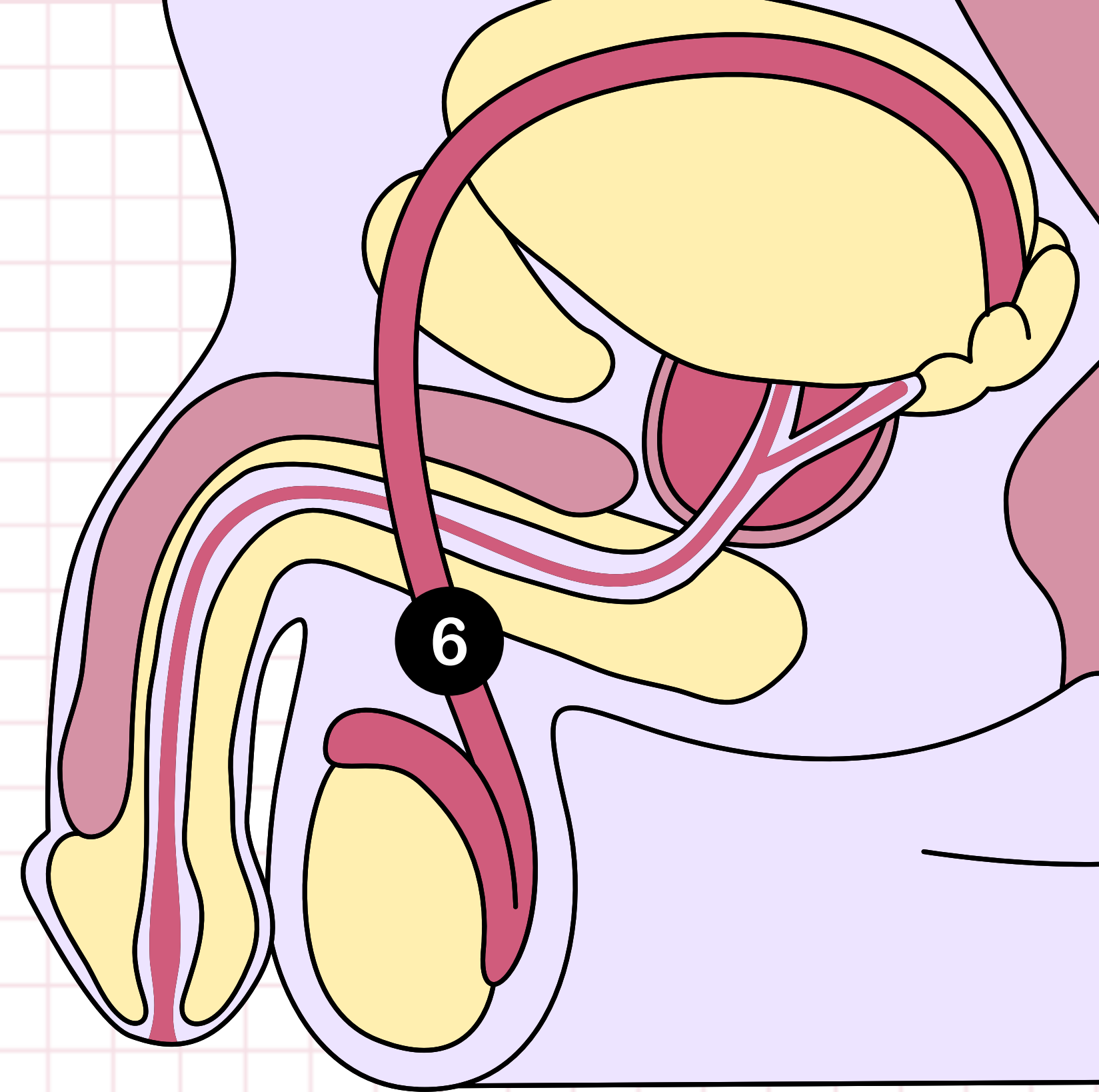
5 - URETHRA

The urethra is a hollow tube which transports urine from the bladder to outside the body. It also transports sperm.



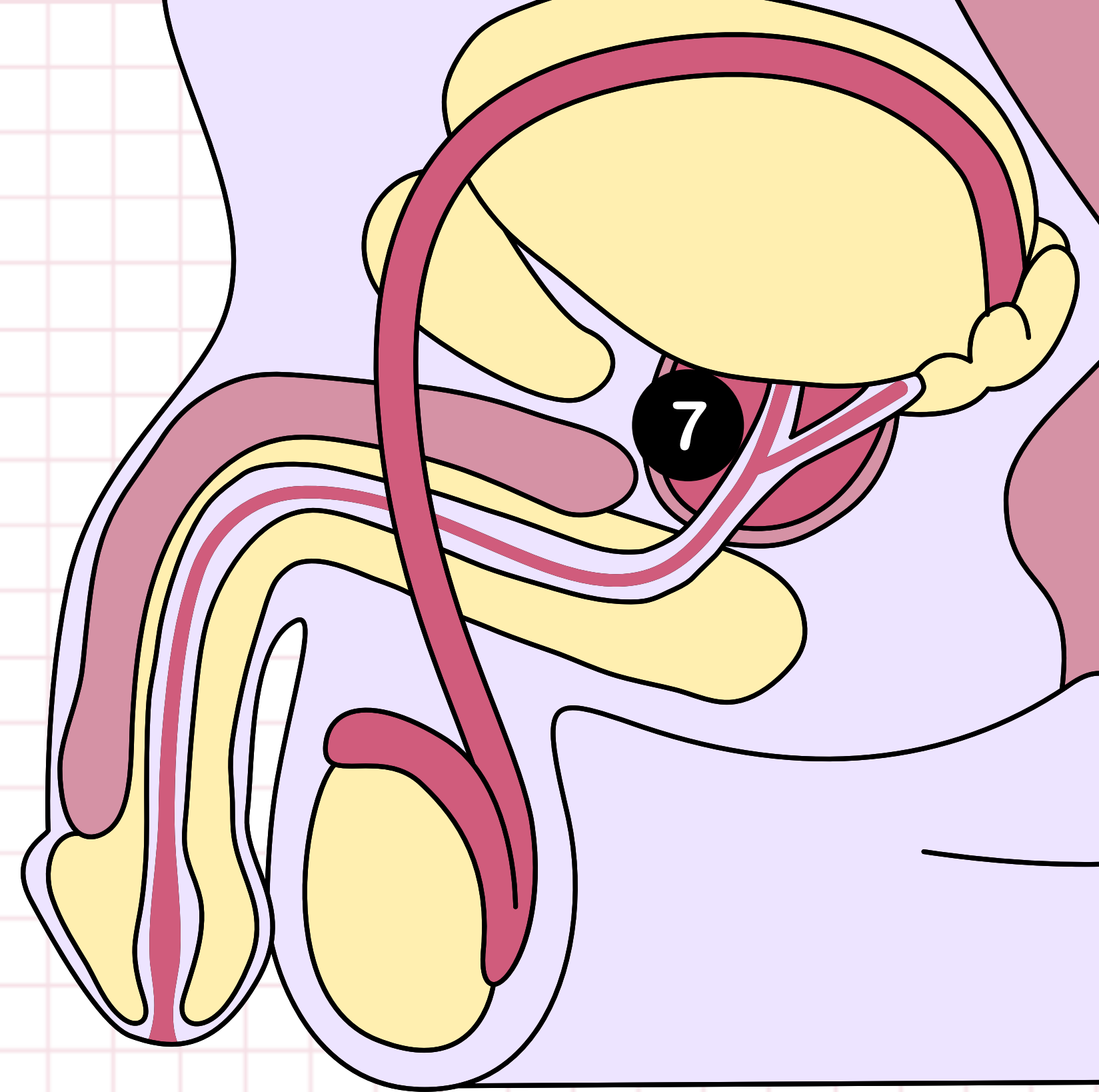
6 - SPERM DUCT

The main role of the sperm ducts are to transport sperm away from the testes, where sperm is made.



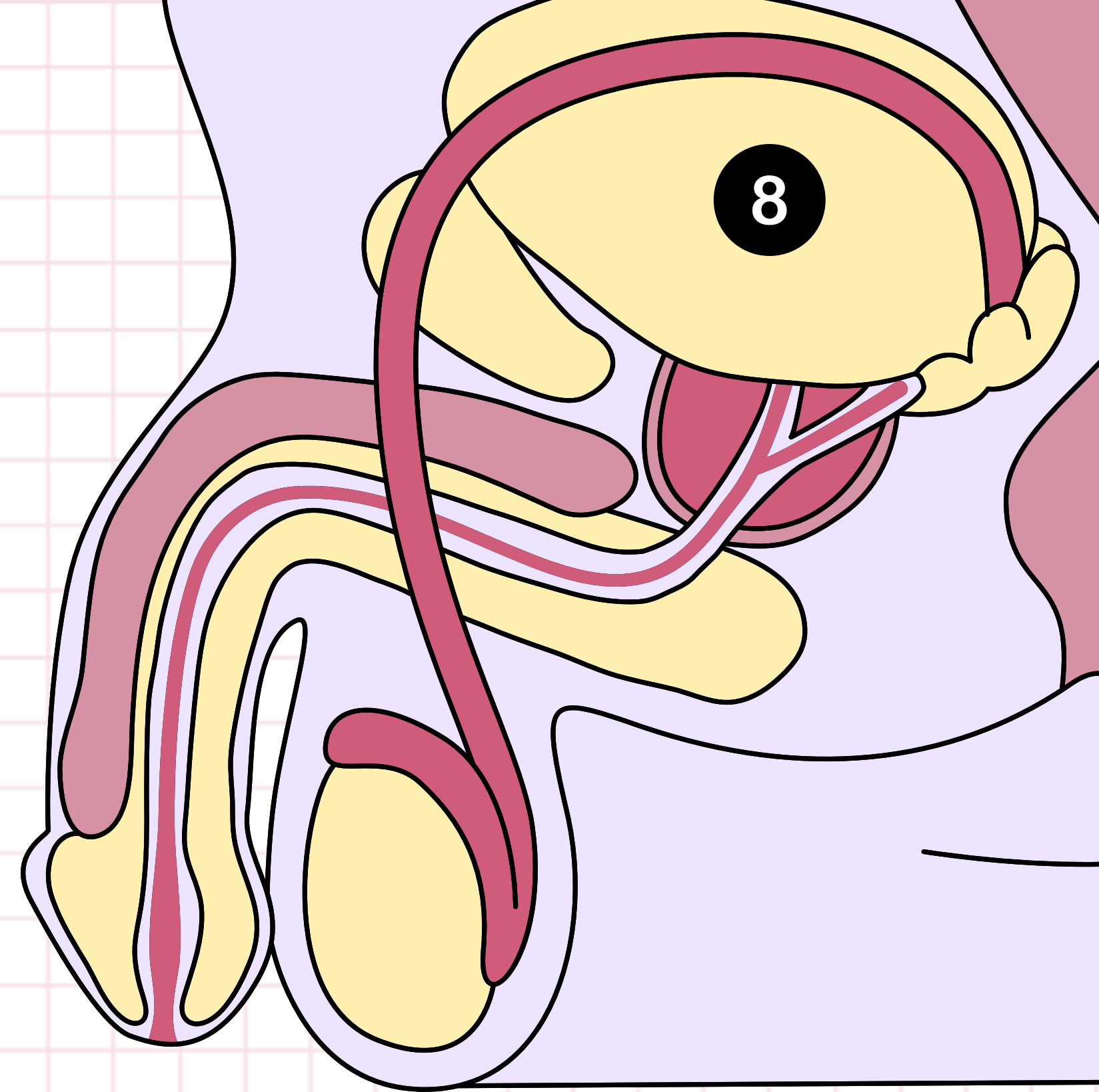
7 - GLANDS

There are a number of different glands in the male reproductive system. They produce fluids to mix with the sperm which supply the sperm with nutrients and help regulate urine flow (e.g. the prostate gland).

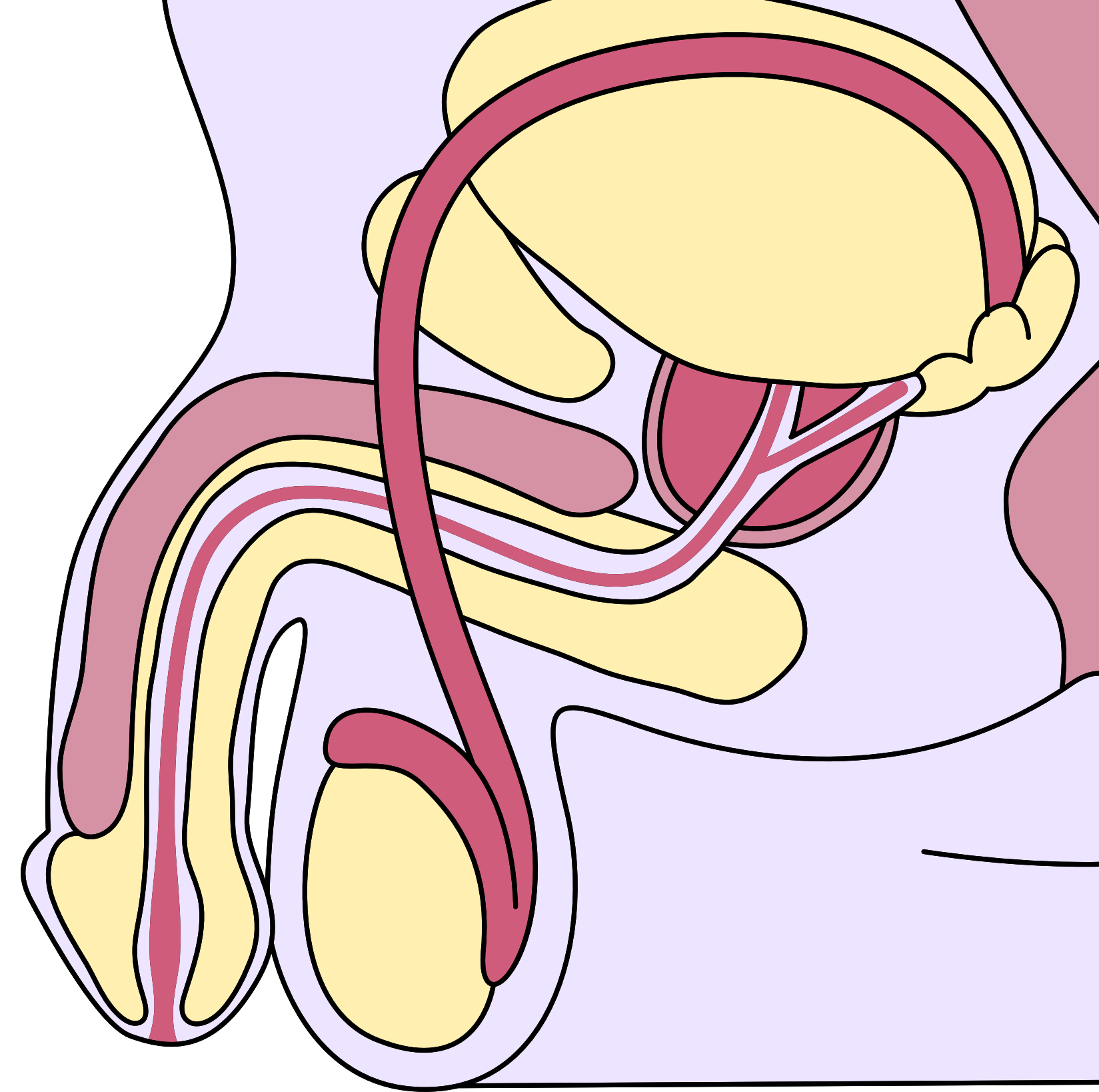
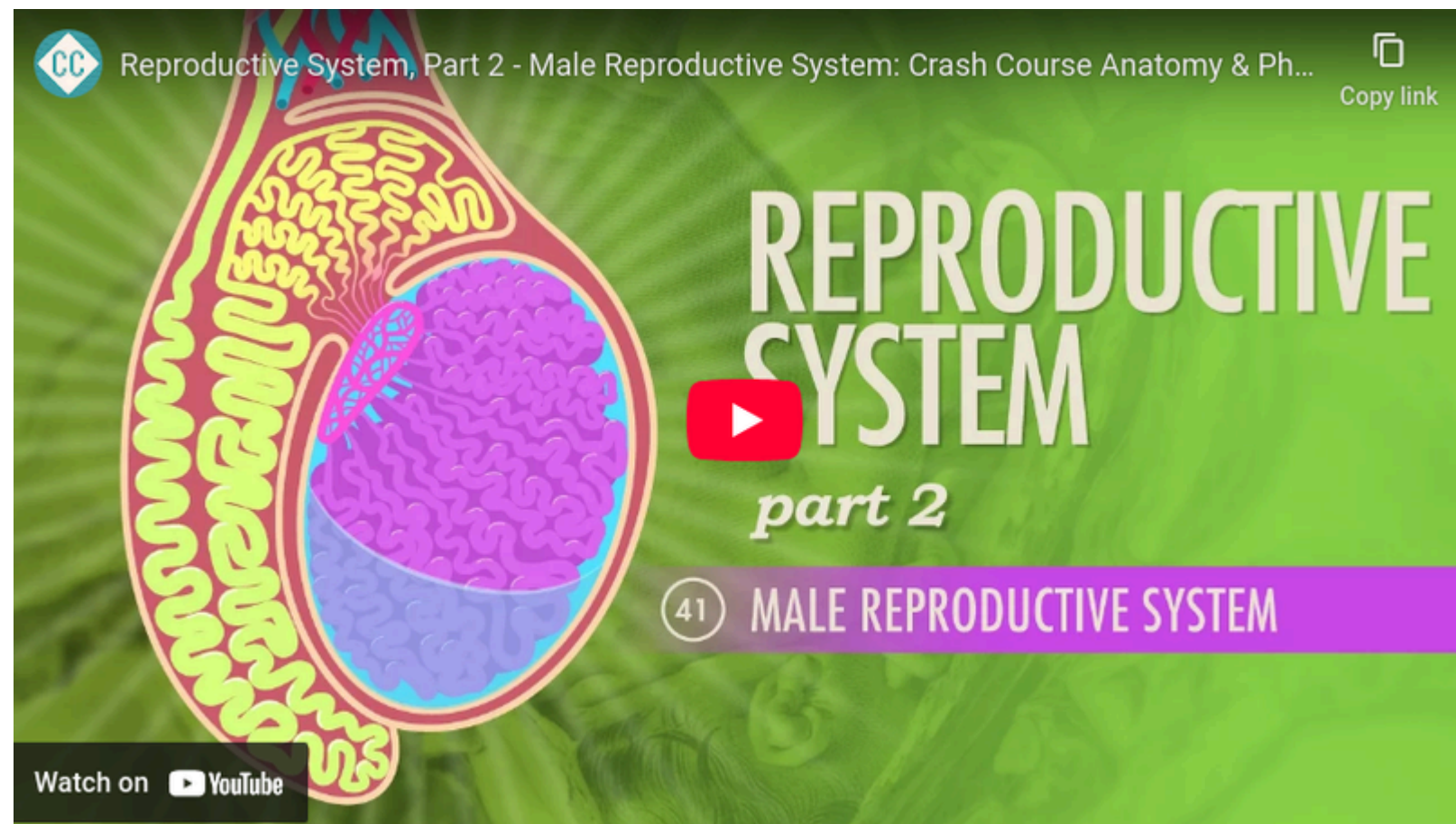


8 - BLADDER

The bladder temporarily stores urine in the body. It helps expel urine from the body by sending nerve signals to the nervous system which tells the brain that you need to go to the toilet.
